# RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AN APPLICATION FOR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE, AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION AND SUBMITTAL OF THE APPLICATION, AND DESIGNATING AN AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVE TO CERTIFY AND SIGN PAYMENT REQUESTS FOR THE DEADWOOD WATER SUPPLY LINE PROJECT

**WHEREAS,** the City of Lead (the "City") has determined it is necessary to proceed with improvements to its water system, including, but not limited to, replacement of approximately one-half (0.5) mile of 6" water line with new water line along Park Avenue (the "Project");

**WHEREAS**, the City has determined that financial assistance will be necessary to undertake the Project and a Drinking Water Facilities Funding Application (the "Application") for financial assistance from the South Dakota Board of Water and Natural Resources (the "Board") will be prepared; and,

**WHEREAS,** it is necessary to designate an authorized representative to execute and submit the Application on behalf of the City and to certify and sign payment requests in the event financial assistance is awarded for the Project.

## **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the City as follows:

- 1. The City hereby approves the submission of the Application for financial assistance in an amount not to exceed \$841,425 to the Board for the Project.
- 2. The Mayor of the City is hereby authorized to execute the Application and submit it to the Board, and to execute and deliver such other documents and perform all acts necessary to effectuate the Application for financial assistance.
- 3. The Mayor of the City is hereby designated as the authorized representative of the City to do all things on its behalf to certify and sign payment requests in the event financial assistance is awarded for the Project.
